4.2. Cooperation activities (ALDE Party, Renew Europe, Liberal International):

ALDE Party

14 March: co-president Ilhan Kuychuyk took part in ALDE-PACE's exchange of views on the military aggression by the Russian Federation against Ukraine and its consequences.

30-31 August: ALDE-PACE President Iulian Bulai participated in the ALDE Party's visit to Ukraine, conducted a series of meetings with the Servant of the People's party, Ukrainian Ombudsman and other officials, and visited Kyiv, Hostomel and Irpin.

20 November: Iulian Bulai took part in the ALDE Party's visit to North Macedonia, met with the new LDP Party chair Monika Zajkova, addressed the regional Liberal Conference "Qvo Vadis Evropa 2022? Fostering EU enlargement and integration" and attended the LDP Party congress. The congress was also addressed by ALDE-PACE members Liliana Tanguy (France, on behalf of Renaissance) and Hamid Hamid (Bulgaria, on behalf of Liberal International)

10 October: ALDE Party co-President Ilhan Kuychuyk and President of LIBSEEN Roman Jakic participated in ALDE-PACE's exchange of views on the European perspectives for the Western Balkans.

Renew Europe Group at the European Parliament

ALDE-PACE and LI continued cooperation on the joint project related to Human Rights and Environment:

1st July: Rik Daems spoke at the Interactive Policy Discussion on Rights-based approach to defending climate justice, in the margins of the Liberal International Congress in Sofia.

4.3. Main topics

War in Ukraine

The topic dominated the agenda with the start of the military aggression launched by the Russian Federation against Ukraine on 24 February 2022.

On 24 February, ALDE-PACE conducted an extraordinary group meeting and condemned the aggression in the strongest terms.

On 14 March, ALDE-PACE unanimously pronounced for the exclusion of the Russian Federation from the Council of Europe.

On 6 April, ALDE-PACE President Jacques Maire took part in the first Council of Europe's visit to Ukraine since the start of the war together with other members of the PACE Presidential Committee

On 28 June, Damien Cottier (Switzerland), Chair of AS/Jur lead a PACE delegation to Ukraine that visited Kyiv, Bucha and Irpin

On 30-31 August, ALDE-PACE's newly elected President Iulian Bulai took part in the ALDE Party's visit to Ukraine, including Kyiv, Hostomel and Irpin.

Several ALDE-PACE members facilitated meetings with fellow members of the Ukrainian delegation organised in national parliaments.

How should the Council of Europe adjust to democracy and human rights challenges in the new geopolitical context?

Since the beginning of the Russian military aggression against Ukraine, ALDE-PACE played a leading role in shaping the future of the Council of Europe and held discussions with its interlocutors, including the Secretary General and the Deputy Secretary General of the Council of Europe, representatives of the chairmanship of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe, and its liberal partners.

ALDE-PACE greatly contributed to reaffirming the Parliamentary Assembly's role in calling for and contributing to the preparation of the Council of Europe's summit of heads of state and government: Fiona O'Loughlin (Ireland) was appointed rapporteur on "A fourth summit for a renewed, improved and reinforced Council of Europe", and three representatives of the group (Iulian Bulai, Damien Cottier and Fiona O'Loughlin) served on the ad hoc committee for the preparation of the summit.

The group's bureau conducted several meetings focusing on the summit and was satisfied with the inclusion of its proposals into the draft resolution prepared by Fiona O'Loughlin.

ALDE-PACE welcomed the Committee of Ministers' decision to conduct the summit in Reykjavik in May 2023.

Political prisoners

ALDE-PACE drew the attention to the situation of political prisoners in Belarus and Russia and held two side events and several exchanges of views.

In January 2022, ALDE-PACE President Jacques Maire presented his report on the Poisoning of Alexei Navalny. Adopted by a strong majority, the resolution concluded that Russian authorities had the obligation to conduct an effective investigation into the poisoning of Alexei Navalny and the involvement of the FSB, as well as into the use of Novichok on the territory of Russia.

The ALDE group conducted a series of events in support of Vladimir Kara-Murza, tabled two motions for a resolution ("Systematic large-scale persecution against anti-war protesters in the Russian Federation" tabled by Jacques Maire, France, and "Sanctions of persons on the 'Kara-Murza list'" tabled by Eerik Kross, Estonia) and supported the motion on "Arbitrary arrest of Russian human rights defender and freedom fighter Vladimir Kara-Murza" moved by the EPP/CD. ALDE welcomed the attribution of the 2022 PACE Vaclav Havel Human Rights Prize to its long-standing partner Vladimir Kara-Murza.

ALDE organised a series of events in support of the Belarusian political prisoners, and raised the issue with its interlocutors, including Sviatlana Tikhonouskaya. Several ALDE-PACE members joined the godparenting initiative in support of Belarusian political prisoners.

ALDE-PACE continuously demands the release of political prisoners and proposed to create a post of General Rapporteur on Political Prisoners in AS/Jur committee.

Defending human rights defenders

In January 2022, ALDE addressed the issue of closure of Memorial, the oldest human rights defence organisation in Russia; several ALDE-PACE members added their signature to the nomination of Memorial for the 2022 Nobel Peace Prize.
